Bring Them Home



There is no way we could print this month's Bulletin without acknowledging the devastating and unprovoked terrorist attacks on Israel on October 7th by Hamas, the rulers of the Gaza Strip who are committed to Israel's destruction. I wish that I did not have to write these words. But more than that, I wish that the 1,400-plus

Israelis murdered in cold blood that day were still with us. I wish that the 200-plus Israeli infants, children, teens, and seniors - some Holocaust survivors - were back home in Israel. I wish that the hundreds of thousands of Israelis from Israel's north and south were back in their towns which have been evacuated. I wish that Israel's justified response could be carried out in a setting away from the Palestinian civilian centers where Hamas and other terror groups such as Palestinian Islamic Jihad have deliberately built their bases, weapons depots, and tunnel networks.

It is hard to recall that on October 6th, Temple gathered for our Sukkot Yizkor service just before the beginning of Shabbat services that evening. As that service was starting, I remarked how it was 50 years on the civil calendar since Israel was surprise-attacked by the armies of Syria and Egypt on Yom Kippur of 1973. I said those words because the start of the Yom Kippur War was such a vivid memory for me, even though I was only 7 years old and thousands of miles away from where the battles were taking place. I contrasted the pain of a half-century ago with the joy we experience on Simchat Torah. Little did anyone know that a heartless and deadly surprise attack by Hamas terrorists was only hours away.

I have heard it said that a heart has two chambers, but even that double capacity isn't enough for times like this. If you are like me, your heart may be breaking twice: for our people in Israel who are living through this horror and fighting back, and for the Palestinians in Gaza whose leaders have so recklessly put in harm's way.

What have we as a Temple done since October 7th?

Within 72 hours, Temple Emanuel was the host-site for the Solidarity with Israel service which brought together all of Greensboro's congregations, our Jewish organizations, Representative Kathy Manning, as well as friends who have been to Israel at one or another time with us. We were also joined by Temple Emanuel of Winston-Salem. The speeches from the evening are on our social media platforms. Pictures from that evening are included in this Bulletin. We are so thankful to the many religious and civic leaders who not only helped make that evening secure and meaningful, but also to the long list of allies who were either with us in person or who sent messages of support.

One of the main items we highlighted is the imperative to give to the Jewish Federation of North America's Israel Emergency Campaign. This unprecedented campaign set and reached the goal of raising \$500 million for vital civil society and social service needs within Israel for the near and longer terms. Even so, this effort to gather resources is continuing. If you haven't already done so, please join those who have already given generously. Donations can be made at www.shalomgreensboro.org.

Temple's Rabbis have been working with families and students, convening a group of high school teens to talk about what they are experiencing in school and on social media. We have also responded to some reports of antisemitism in our area schools and beyond. I was interviewed a number of times and was a guest on the local Finding Common Ground podcast; Rabbi Guttman had an op-ed piece in the News & Record. We arranged an exclusive Temple Zoom with Jerusalem-based author Sarah Tuttle-Singer who shared her writing and insights from up close. We have done all of this while inviting your comments and questions, counseling many, connecting with civic and clergy leaders within and beyond the Jewish world, and caring for our family and large circle of friends in Israel.

At times such as these, being together is a natural and meaningful response. Shabbat services are always filled with songs of peace and hope. We have added a special prayer on behalf of those taken hostage by Hamas. In addition, an empty chair now sits on our bimah with pictures of some of those taken from Israel and being held by Hamas in Gaza. The sign includes the message: Bring Them Home. We have also added an extra candle to the two that we light at the start of each Shabbat service to signal that we have not lost hope for the Israeli hostages to be reunited with their family and friends. Blue ribbons are available at Temple serving as another reminder of our solidarity with Israel. We look forward to the day, God willing very soon, when we can remove these symbols because our people will be back home, safe with their family and friends.

May the vision spoken by the prophet Jeremiah (31:17) during ancient times of trouble be realized soon: *v'shavu vanim lig'vulam* - that children, of any age, will soon return to their borders.
