Be With Them

The other day I did something that I rarely do: I went back and read my Yom Kippur morning sermon.

The sermon was about what large segments of Israel's society was doing to preserve its democratic institutions. It seems like ages ago when Israelis were taking to the streets every Saturday night. During Sukkot, we gathered dozens in front of Temple's Sukkah with flags and signs supporting their efforts.

There was one sentence that I repeated over and over in that Yom Kippur sermon:

When your family is in peril, be with them.

There is no way, at that time, that I could have imagined what Israel would experience less than two weeks later.

When your family is in peril, be with them.

That is why so many of us, myself included, pivoted after the October 7th Simchat Torah attacks against Israel by Hamas terrorists. That is why we have pushed back against the negative framings of Israel and avoided the seemingly simple solutions to a very complicated issue. That is why some allyships have been rethought and some friendships have either been put on hold or have needed to end. That is why, even though we are horrified by the impacts of war on all innocents, we have remained focused on bringing home those taken captive from Israel into Gaza.

For the past few weeks I have been walking around with a piece of masking tape on my shirt. Each day I write the next number on it. 100...101...102... and so forth. It breaks my heart each time I write that next number. 103... 104...105...

I pray that by the time that you are reading this the 136 remaining hostages from Israel will be back with their families.

Just a few days ago, I headed to Israel with a Solidarity mission organized by the Greensboro Jewish Federation. I felt like I was carrying the prayers and deepest connections of our community to Israel with me during that time.

Why? Because:

When your family is in peril, be with them.

I have so much more to say which is why I invite you to come to Temple on Thursday night, February 15th at 7:30 pm for a special evening "Schmooze". That night, both Rabbi Guttman and I will reflect on our recent experiences on solidarity missions to Israel. In addition to all of the amazing offerings that we have planned in February which you can read about in this Bulletin, I truly hope that you will plan to be at Temple for our "Schmooze" that night.

ASSISTANT RABBI/DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION:

Congratulations to Rabbi Fisher on her new role as Associate Rabbi of Congregation Kol Ami, in White Plains, NY, starting July 2024. Upcoming celebrations with our TE family will be announced. I am optimistic that we will soon be announcing our new Assistant Rabbi/Director of Education. The search committee has done an exceptional job. The process to hire rabbinic professionals is set by the Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR), and is now more time-sensitive than it was in 2020. The committee, chaired by Amy Epstein and including Rabbi Koren have:

- ✧ Updated the job description and created the job posting for the CCAR job board,
- ✧ Submitted the job posting at the earliest date allowed by the CCAR,
- ✧ Promptly interviewed all applicants via Zoom,
- ✧ Invited three qualified candidates for 2-day local visits and interviews,
- ✧ Selected the most qualified candidate to make an official offer.

URJ 150 CONFERENCE:

In December, I attended the URJ 150 in Washington, DC with our rabbis. We met with many new and old friends, and heard inspiring speeches from Rabbi Rick Jacobs and others. Second Gentleman Douglas Emhoff was a featured speaker. Our own Dana Bederson sang, and shared the stage with big names like Julie Silver, Jeff Klepper and Rabbi Daniel Freeland!



WHODUNNIT MYSTERY DINNER:

This wonderful fundraiser dinner show, written by Andy Schlosberg, with a fabulous cast of actors - including teens and our multi-talented rabbis - was so much fun! The event was organized by Tammie Geier, with catering by our own Brotherhood and Sisterhood, and wine and party drinks provided by the Board of Trustees.

SECURITY NEWS:

Thank you, Temple Emanuel community, for your incredible response to the November request for donations to cover immediate security enhancements! We now have security professionals onsite when children are present in the building, as well as during services and special events. We continue to enhance security and safety, while maintaining our warm and welcoming environment with some discreet, but critical initiatives:

- ✧ 3M shatter-resistant film has been installed on all glass windows and doors.
- ✧ Our 2023 federal grant for \$150,000 has been approved. We will install safety bollards and landscaping for exterior security, and upgrade lights and CCTV.
- ✧ Our 2024 federal grant planning is underway. The security committee will prioritize needs and begin the 2024 application process.
- ✧ The Board approved purchase of a walk-through metal detector, to enhance security when we welcome the wider community to events such as the Jewish Festival.
- ✧ Regular security announcements - We now provide a brief security announcement before gatherings and services, to point out exits and rally points.
- ✧ Security text messaging service - we are using an app called Remind for messaging ECEC and Keshar parents with security-related announcements.

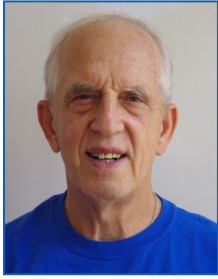

Temple Emanuel Archives

Jillian M. Hinderliter recently visited the Temple Emanuel Archives to conduct research for a book project. Dr. Hinderliter is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Women's and Gender Studies at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill. Professor Hinderliter's current book project explores how American Jewish women contributed to the feminist critique of modern medicine and worked to reform



American health care from the late 1960s through the 1980s. Using organizational records, personal papers, and oral histories, she argues that Jewish activists helped found and sustain the women's health movement at national, regional, and local levels.

Throughout the Fall 2023 semester, Professor Hinderliter visited Temple Emanuel's archive at Greene Street to research how the National Council of Jewish Women-Greensboro section, Temple Sisterhood, Temple leadership, and the Greensboro Jewish community discussed or participated in women's health activism during the 1960s through the 1980s. She is also interested in how the community responded to the feminist movement broadly. Professor Hinderliter hopes to include more southern narratives in her book on the women's health movement. If you were a women's health activist in Greensboro or elsewhere in the South during these decades, Professor Hinderliter would like to learn more about your experiences! Professor Hinderliter would like to express her special thanks to Brenda Henley and Anne Parsons for arranging access to the collection. She looks forward to continuing to work with the important materials preserved in the Temple Emanuel archive.
