

Rededication, Resilience, Light, and Hope



In ancient times, the Maccabees were the light and hope that redeemed our people. Never have I felt the need for Hanukkah and its message of light, hope, and redemption more than I feel it this year.

The time between October 7th when Israel was surprised-attacked on the

Shabbat of Simchat Torah and the start of this month has been marked by devastation.

Then again, it has also been filled with tremendous moments where light and hope have shone through.

I don't need to list the problems here. But I do want to highlight some of the outstanding sources of light and hope during these past unforgettable weeks:

- ❖ Israelis of all backgrounds have banded together. This is quite amazing given the fight to preserve democratic norms that consumed Israel for the first nine months of the year. Overnight, Israelis realized that while their differences are real, there is more that unites them than what divides them.
- ☼ Israeli children and women, as well as some foreign nationals, have started coming home, ending their nightmare of being Hamas' hostages in Gaza. We have 240 Israeli flags around Temple's fountain area; some of us have put Kidnapped signs in prominent places around town. We are participating in the Blue Ribbon campaign to #BringThemHome. Seeing the first of these reunions has brought tears of joy to our eyes and a well-needed light to our world. We will not rest until all are accounted for, safe and back home where they belong.
- ❖ The November 14th March for Israel that took place in Washington, DC was the largest such gathering on behalf of Israel in our country's history, attracting nearly 300,000 in person and another 250,000 participating in real-time online. The teens and adults from Temple Emanuel and the broader Jewish community of Greensboro, led by our Federation, were a source of strength for so many here at home and in Israel.
- ♦ There has been an outpouring of generosity, with so many from Temple reaching into their pockets to participate in the Emergency Campaign for Israel. If you have yet to do so, please go to www.shalomgreensboro.org to contribute. And be sure to come to the Arts and Crafts Sale for Israel on Sunday, December 3rd; all proceeds will be given to the Emergency Campaign.

- There are not enough thanks for the generosity that has poured forth from Temple families as our security needs have dramatically increased. In these unprecedented times, our congregation has not only risen to the occasion; we have also stood strong and had each other's backs. Remember: if you ever encounter antisemitism, please let one of your Rabbis know we are here to help!
- Doing mitzvot and helping others has continued, and even grown, during these tough times. Moreover, over the past two months our Temple celebrated three weddings and four Bar and Bat Mitzvahs.
- ☼ Finally, I would be remiss if I didn't mention the many friends from beyond the Jewish community who have reached out with their support. We have learned some hard lessons these past weeks about who are true friends are. The messages and friendly support we have received has made being Jewish a little less lonely. Personally, it has been a reminder that there is still hope for meaningful community relations in a world that has sadly been signaling otherwise.

We have these reasons and so many more to amplify light in our world this Hanukkah. One of our teens said it so powerfully in the days following October 7th: "Now is the time for us to be even more involved with Judaism and with Temple." That is how we show resistance! That is how we stand up during difficult times! That is how we exhibit deep solidarity! That is how we live up to the true meaning of Hanukkah - our holiday of rededication, resilience, light, and hope!

Light your candles this year. Place them in your window. Return to Temple, again and again. Together we will be the light and hope that will redeem our people and world.

Michal, our family, and I wish you and yours a Hanukkah filled with meaning and with light. We look forward to being with you at our WhoDunnit event on December 2nd, during Hanukkah, and throughout the month.

Reflection on Israel Rally in DC from Emily Kranz

For a people who proudly uphold the stereotype that a group of [two] Jews hold [three] different opinions, the March for Israel in Washington DC was an extraordinary day of solidarity. More than 290,000 people showed up on the National Mall to support Israel and demand that the hostages be released, and more than 250,000 people watched the event live online. These numbers represents 5% and 10% of the estimated 5.8 million Jews in America respectively. FIVE PERCENT of the Jewish population of America came to Washington DC [on November 14] to show their support for our nation of Israel.



I experienced an amazing feeling of insignificance standing on the mall in the vast crowds of people - what did it matter that Rodney and I showed up when there were so many people? Our voices and clapping couldn't possibly be heard amongst the din, we were not the most flamboyantly dressed and we never actually found our Greensboro Federation group in the melee....



But every single person standing in DC made the choice to be there and represent our people, to have our voices heard, to show that we will not give up supporting the right for Israel to exist safely as a nation. It took every single person there to create history, the orthodox, the locals, the converts and rabbis, the young and old - everyone contributed, including me.

Top leadership for both Democrats and Republicans from the House and Senate spoke - each reiterating in an official capacity that the United States stands behind Israel. Mike Johnson even said that current calls for a cease fire were "outrageous" and that Israel would not cease fire until we are no longer under the threat of Hamas. Ambassador Deborah Lipstadt spoke powerfully on behalf

of the [White House], and I was heartened with this show of government support. I was also very proud to see [Rep.] Kathy Manning deliver part of the prayer (which included Hebrew!) for the Hostages with the Bipartisan Task Force Combating Antisemitism

Three family members of kidnapped hostages spoke, each eloquently and with a distinct message - Hirsch's mom spoke about how he and all the hostages are family with ALL of us, how calling for the release of innocent civilian hostages is an act of love, not war, and how the non-Jewish world has turned their back on these innocents in the 39 days since they were kidnapped. Every speaker shared the desperate plea to bring them home NOW...



Thank you to everyone here and at JFNA who helped make it happen, especially the [Federation] staff who made sure that everyone was well cared

for and returned home safely! To close I would just like to observe that once again Greensboro punched above our weight class, sending [two] full busses from our community to the march.

To everyone who attended I say: There's learning history, there's witnessing history, and there's making history. [On November 14,] we made history!



Honor Card Sale for Greensboro Urban Ministry




