Joanne and Arthur Bluethenthal were truly giants in our Jewish and Greensboro community for decades, earning accolades for their community work and generosity.

Both were leaders of Temple Emanuel, with Arthur serving as Temple President from 1976-1978, and Joanne leading many committees and initiatives. Both were active in the wider Jewish community at the highest level of volunteerism, Arthur serving the Greensboro Jewish Federation as the Annual Campaign Chair and as Vice President, and Joanne earning several important honors from the national and local Jewish community throughout her career as a 'Volunteer Professional', as she called herself.

Both she and Arthur were on many non-sectarian boards and commissions as well, including Joanne's term on the Guilford County School Board. Together they lived a life dedicated to civic engagement, community building, religious devotion and social change.

This year, following Joanne's passing last year, the Joanne and Arthur Bluethenthal Fund for Temple Emanuel was established. The Fund shall be used for the purpose of enhancing the religious life and education of the members of Temple of all ages, including the support of the general operation and the material needs of the Temple's Religious School and its Pre-School.

The Temple anticipates that the annual withdrawal from the Fund for the Temple's benefit will help ameliorate budget pressures and assure the future of the Temple Religious School and Pre-School.
