
Federation Interfaith Trip

Panim el Panim: A Congregational Dialogue About Israel and the Palestinian People

Saturday, November 1 | 5:00pm



In moments of conflict and heartbreak, it can feel easier to turn away – from the news, from one another, from the pain. Yet our tradition calls us instead to turn *panim el panim*, face to face, with our community. Join our larger Temple Emanuel community for a gathering of reflection, learning, and conversation to process what is on our hearts about the Middle East. Together, through a mix of small group and large group conversations, we will seek to approach this moment with open hearts, deep listening, and the courage to meet one another's humanity. Diverse voices are welcome. Our aim is to understand one another, learn, and grow. We will anchor our gathering in ritual, beginning with song and concluding with Havdalah. *Please sign up if you plan to attend, so we can plan accordingly.*

Jewish Meditation & A New Shabbat Opportunity



While Jewish meditation has become popular in recent decades, it has deep Jewish roots. The early mystics of Tz'fat practiced *Hitbodedut*, a form of meditation and spontaneous prayer. According to the Reform Movement, "*Hitbodedut* is the act of open, spontaneous, and direct communication with God, and is accessible to all...*Hitbodedut* lets us speak our minds and hearts, embrace our vulnerability, and open ourselves to what the universe has to offer." *Hitbodedut* as a style of prayer was first popularized by the Hasidic master Rebbe Nachman of Breslov.

In fact, Rebbe Nachman of Bratzlav taught that, through *hitbodedut*, one could speak to God "as one speaks with a friend," listening deeply to the silence between words. Even the structure of Jewish prayer, which can feel rote and proscribed at times, contains moments of mindful connection, whether it be during the prayers for our body, soul, and the miracles of daily life, the inclusion of listening and stillness before Shema, or silence during and after our standing prayer, the Amidah.

Shabbat itself is our Jewish weekly practice in mindfulness, a 25-hour meditation in sacred time. As Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel wrote, "The Sabbath is a sanctuary in time." It invites us to step out of the rush of the week and into a rhythm that is slower, gentler, and more alive.

The Institute for Jewish Spirituality (IJS) was created in 1999 to help people navigate our often turbulent world by learning to slow down, reconnect with ourselves, and find a greater sense of purpose, all grounded in the

deep wisdom of Jewish tradition. IJS describes itself as a "sacred haven for nurturing the mind, body, soul, and spirit." Their importance and offerings have only grown over time, especially during and following the pandemic. I have found my learning with IJS to be some of the most meaningful and applicable Jewish learning I have done in recent years. I encourage you to explore their website, <https://www.jewishspirituality.org/> to learn more. They offer a myriad of free, online resources, as well as a daily online meditation sit on Mondays - Fridays, 12:30pm - 1:00pm EST.

The benefits of Jewish meditation and mindfulness are many, so we have decided to bring a new offering to Temple Emanuel following the strong interest in the mindfulness offering on Yom Kippur. On Saturday, November 15, at 10:30am, following Chevra Torah, join us for our first Shabbat Neshama. This new offering will be led by Nichol Walters, who offered our Yom Kippur mindfulness hour, along with our rabbis.

Neshama means both breath and soul and we will be focusing on both. Prayer is not only something we say, but something we feel and experience. Through meditation, silence, reflection, prayer, and music, we will create a new space where our body, heart and soul can rest and be refreshed together.

The Temple Emanuel Social Action Committee, in coordination with the Interfaith Immigrant Justice Coalition of Greensboro, is helping support a young family who has escaped violence from their countries of origin. Now new parents to a 6-month-old baby, the married couple was independent and self-supporting until recent executive orders caused the father to lose his permit to work. Paying for the basic necessities, which include rent, groceries and utilities, has become a major challenge. Our goal in assisting this family is to reestablish their independence so they can once again thrive on their own. The family needs temporary financial support and may need assistance with other issues as they arise. We have been forming a team and raising funds. Temple Emanuel's Inaugural Mah Jongg Tournament | Sunday, November 9 | 1:00-5:30pm




Doors open at 12:15 for registration. Play begins promptly at 1:00




"First Friday" Shabbat Service at Greene Street | November 7 | 6:30pm




