Challenges and Celebrations



December 2023 is a month that will live with me for a long time; it was filled with the height of celebrations and deep challenges.

I'll start with the challenges.

City Councils became the most recent nationwide focus of one-sided anti-Israel campaigns. Greensboro wasn't immune to this, as speaker after speaker maligned Israel without mentioning that the war was brutally initiated by Hamas terrorists from Gaza. Asking City officials to take stances on foreign policy questions doesn't seem problematic at first blush, until we remember that the only time that this happens is when Israel is involved. Overlooking terror directed at Israel, using slogans that erase Jewish sovereignty, and applying a unique standard when Israel and/or Jews are involved has one name: antisemitism. We've seen this for years as Student Governments have been presented with resolutions condemning Israel for existing, promoting boycotts, and calling for divestment from Israel. Now we are seeing a coordinated campaign directed at intelligent, wellmeaning City Councils whose responsibilities are local, not international. We have communicated to many of our City representatives that passing a symbolic resolution about a war thousands of miles away will not make Israelis or Gazans any safer, but it will signal to our local Jewish community that whoever is loudest will get their way and that local Jewish safety and security concerns are irrelevant.

A second overt act of antisemitism took place as Hanukkah was beginning. The monument to the Women of the Shoah (Holocaust) located downtown in LeBauer Park was defaced. Among other things, a swastika was painted inside of the Jewish star on that memorial. While a suspect has been charged, this was a terrible moment not just for us as Jews, but for Greensboro as a whole. When faced with such adversity, I think of the Hanukkah song that starts with the words *ba'nu choshech I'gareish*. Its message is similar to what the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King once said: "Darkness cannot drive out

darkness, only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate, only love can do that."

So what were the moments of celebration?

First, the absolute joy that was present at Temple throughout Hanukkah. Your presence, and the light from the candles that you lit, especially that Friday night for Shabbanukkah, and that Saturday for Havdalakkah, were inspiring.

I will never forget the last night of Hanukkah, when a



large group of Jews and our allies, together with Mayor Nancy Vaughan and other city officials, went to the Women of the Shoah monument to "rededicate" it; keep in mind that the Hebrew word Hanukkah means "rededication." Temple's Victoria Milstein, the artist who worked tirelessly to create that sacred space, was there, as were Rabbi Fisher, Rabbi Gleason from Beth David Synagogue, and I. Nine women held candles as a "human menorah." Our light that evening was more powerful than any hatred.

A second moment of light was the weekend convened in Washington by the Reform movement to mark 150 years of our presence in North America. Temple's President



Paul Benson, Rabbi Fisher, and I were there, as were movement and congregational leaders from across the US and Canada. Not only did we celebrate the many contours of a movement committed to questions, explorations, change, and inclusion, but we lifted up the songs, prayers, and ideas that are central to the traditions of liberal Judaism. There was also an acknowledgment of times that mistakes were made and abuses ignored; there were deep apologies and promises to do better. Above all, there was a sense that the coming years and decades will see a further flourishing of Reform Judaism, nationally as well as worldwide.

It was such a blessing that the senior leadership of Israel's Reform Movement were at this conference, including Anna Kislanski [*Right in photo*] who leads the movement



there (https://reform.org.il/en/), Orly Erez-Likhovski [Left in photo], Executive Director of the Israel Religious Action Center (www.irac.org), and Rabbi Gilad Kariv, a leader of the Labor Party

and a current Member of Knesset. Being with Israelis, hearing them reflect on October 7th, how they have helped the hundreds of thousands internally displaced in Israel as war is being waged, as well as their concern for the nearly 130 hostages still being held by Hamas, was a bright light at a very difficult time. These same leaders were on the front-lines of the movement to defend Israel's democratic norms for the 10 months leading up to Hamas' attacks. Their work building congregations and standing up for the values that resonate for Reform Jews worldwide, and especially in Israel, was on full display. I hope to get to Israel soon. But, connecting in Washington with old and new friends from the Israeli Reform movement was a source of inspiration. Our movement will only strengthen if we go forward, and build deeper ties, together.

2024 has begun. I pray that it will bring better news here at home, in Israel, and around the world. My blessings to you and yours.

Spread the Blue Ribbons

You may have seen or wear one of the blue ribbons we pin on our shirts to signify "standing with Israel." They were available in the Temple lobby shortly after October 7, 2023, but were all gone after a few short weeks. Barbara Krueger, a lifetime sewer, found two rolls of blue ribbon in her sewing stash. A quick trip to the store secured a batch of small safety pins. When residents at WhiteStone, where the Kruegers live, asked the significance of the ribbon, in return they were asked: if they had a ribbon, would they wear it? Most said yes, and were given one. Carolyn Cotton, a neighbor of the Kruegers wanted her own supply to spread around and provided the gold safety pins. If you walk around in social spaces at WhiteStone, you just might see numbers of people wearing blue ribbons! (Note- we have a new supply of blue ribbons in the Temple lobby.)


