Our Word Cloud



I recently saw a "word cloud" for the month of November. In a word cloud, the biggest words are the ones mentioned most frequently. Thanksgiving, family, football, autumn, and pumpkin were among the terms that stood out.

What would a Temple Emanuel word cloud for November look like?

NCCJ, aka North Carolina for Community and Justice. Besides having its offices on the campus of our historic Temple downtown, the NCCJ of the Piedmont Triad's mission truly resonates with ideas central to Reform Judaism. Whether working to counter bias, bigotry, racism, and antisemitism, or connecting with youth from diverse places throughout our area, the NCCJ has been a key partner of Temple Emanuel for as long as anyone can remember.

Tom and Linda Sloan will be honored as Citation Award Recipients at the NCCJ dinner which takes place annually each November. Their work in our area, and especially with Temple Emanuel, is legendary; the NCCJ will celebrate what we as a Temple have known for a long time. I am so proud of Tom and Linda and truly grateful for all that they have done within and beyond our congregation for decades. Their leadership has been invaluable! I, together with so many who will be at the Citation Dinner, look forward to celebrating them for this high honor.

Each year at the NCCJ dinner I look at the decades-long list of Citation recipients; if I am not mistaken, roughly 20% of all honorees are Temple Emanuel members. They include civic leaders, business icons, our Rabbi Emeritus, and dedicated volunteers. Not only that, NCCJ Board leaders and students involved in their various programs have deep ties to Temple. NCCJ would rightfully appear large in Temple's November word cloud.

A second larger word for November would be **elections**. Each November we have elections in the US. If you are registered and have yet to vote, I encourage you and others in your family/friend circle to do so. I also want to lift up the work of the many Temple members who have dedicated their efforts to this central American right. From those who have been involved in Get Out The Vote campaigns, to those who have led voter registration drives, to those who have advocated for voting rights and so much more, your efforts have been in line with the time-honored stances taken by Temple Rabbis and our movement.

This November will also mark the fifth time in four years that Israelis are going to the polls. While the outcome of American elections are often easy to analyze within hours or days of the end of voting, the same cannot be said about Israeli elections. It takes roughly three months for Governments to form. The question in recent years, and one of the reasons why there have been so many elections, is if a government can be formed. If not, there may be a sixth election in the not-so-distant future. We will just have to wait and see.

Speaking of **Israel**, November is an important month in modern Jewish history, at least as it relates to the creation of Israel. In early November of 1917, as the Ottoman Empire was collapsing, the British government issued the Balfour Declaration recognizing the right for a "national home for the Jewish people" in our historic lands. 30 years later, on Thanksgiving weekend of 1947, the United Nations voted on the partition resolution, giving legal recognition for a Jewish state to be created following the end of the British Mandate for Palestine.

Last but not least, **Thanksgiving** is a major entry in our November word cloud too. For years, we have broken this into two words: <u>thanks</u> and <u>giving</u>. While gratitude is something that we will always emphasize, we have focused more on **giving**, especially to those who might otherwise go without. I hope that you will be generous

to local hunger relief projects, just as we were this High Holidays when our Corners of the Field collection brought over 2000 pounds of food to the Jewish Family Services' Food Pantry. Make it a point to participate in Greensboro Urban Ministry's Feast of Caring, whether in person or remotely. Make this more than just a time of gratitude; make it a time of dedicated **giving**!


NCCJ Dinner | Wednesday, November 9 | 6:00p-9:30p


ShinShiniot


